Message from the Principal

Clara Love Families,

One of our goals this year is to ensure that every student attends school regularly. Attendance has a huge impact on a student's academic success starting in kindergarten and continuing through high school. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and in life.

We realize some absences are unavoidable due to illness or other circumstances. We also know that when students miss too much school—regardless of the reason – it can cause them to fall behind academically. Your child is less likely to succeed if he or she is chronically absent. Research shows:

- Children chronically absent in kindergarten and 1st grade are much less likely to read at grade level by the end of 3rd grade.
- By 6th grade, chronic absence is a proven early warning sign for students at risk for dropping out of school.

- By 9th grade good attendance can predict graduation rates even better than 8th grade test scores.

Absences can add up quickly. A child is chronically absent if he or she misses just two days every month! Clearly going to school regularly matters!

Here are a few practical tips to help support regular attendance:

- Make sure your children keep a regular bedtime and establish a morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Ensure your children go to school every day unless they are truly sick
- Avoid scheduling vacations or doctor's appointments when school is in session. The attendance bell rings at 9:30. Students are counted absent if they are not present at 9:30.
- Talk to teachers and counselors for advice if your children feel anxious about going to school.
- Develop back up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, neighbor, or another parent to take your child to school.

Let us know how we can best support you and your children so that they can show up for school on time every day. We want your child to be successful in school! If you have any questions or need more information please contact us at any time.

Northwest ISD enables parents to monitor grades, progress reports, report cards, assignments, and attendance information using the Home Access Center (HAC). You can also view standardized test results from prior years.

Important: Beginning 2017-2018, we will not be printing progress reports and report cards for 1st-5th graders unless we receive a parent request to do so. Completing the login process through the HAC now is highly recommended so there is not a delay in getting progress reports next week.

You should have received an email from gradebook@nisdtx.org with the subject NISD Home Access Center. This email provides login information for the HAC. You only need one login for all students in your family.
